

# CHERRY VALLEY POLICE DEPT CRIME ALERT

DATE	DESCRIPTION
09-19-08	At 4:25 pm Officers were dispatched to the Road Ranger Gas Station for a disorderly call. The complainant stated while she was standing next to her vehicle, a gray Ford Taurus with two black males pulled up next to her. The one male made her a sexual offer, and when it was declined the two males drove away.
09-24-08	At 3:38 pm Officers were dispatched to Baumann Park in regards to found property. Recovered were a CB Radio, and a Telescope.
10-02-08	At 2:03 pm Officers were dispatched to the Cherry Valley School in regards to two dogs chasing, barking, and nipping at parents and children that were being picked up after school. The dogs were chased from the school area to the owner's home. Both dogs were contained, and Animal Control was called.
10-04-08	At 2:34 pm Officers were dispatched to the Shell Gas Station for a fight. Upon arrival all involved had left. Clerk gave description of suspects. Later one suspect was stopped and questioned.
10-04-08	At 2:37am Officers were dispatched to a residence for a sick, incoherent juvenile. It was discovered that Juvenile was intoxicated, and was transported to hospital.

**Did You Know?** The following Village Ordinance regulates trucks on our streets.

## **Sec. 70-32. Operation of trucks on residential street.**

- (a) *Prohibited generally.* No person shall operate or cause to be operated on any village street except Newburg Road from the easterly to westerly limits of the village and Lyford Road/Mill Road from Business 20 to Newburg Road, a vehicle which has a gross weight and maximum load of 12,001 pounds or more or motorized equipment licensed for a gross weight of 12,001 pounds or more on any residential street, except as provided in this subsection and in subsection (b) of this section.

(b) *Exceptions.* The prohibition contained in subsection (a) of this section shall not prohibit:

- (1) *Emergency vehicles.* The operation of emergency vehicles upon residential streets;
- (2) *Public utilities.* The operation of vehicles owned or operated by the village, public utilities, or any contractor materialman while engaged in the repair, maintenance or construction of streets, village-owned utilities or privately owned utilities within the village, or vehicles owned and operated by other public bodies, public utilities or any contractor or materialman while traveling to or from streets, public or private utilities or facilities owned and maintained by such other public body or utility where the only access to such utilities or facilities owned and maintained by the other public body or utility is over a village residential street;
- (3) *Local destination or origination.* The operation of vehicles upon residential street where necessary to the conduct of business or the service of an occupant at a destination or origination point within the village and requiring travel on residential streets or within another municipality or unincorporated area where the only access thereto is over village residential streets;
- (4) *Detoured vehicles.* The operation of vehicles upon residential streets which are officially established as a detour for a truck route; and
- (5) *Vehicles registered to residences.* Vehicles registered to residences which are parked or stored at a resident's home which vehicles normally would be in violation of subsection (a) of this section.

(c) *Posting.* The village shall post at all entrances to the village the appropriate signage which informs a person entering the village in a vehicle which is in violation of subsection (a) of this section of the prohibition of such vehicles on the village roadways.

(d) *Enforcement.* The village clerk shall keep and maintain accurate maps showing the location of truck routes and residential streets. The maps shall be kept on file in the office of the village clerk, and shall be made available to the public. All streets upon which truck traffic is prohibited (residential streets) shall be clearly posted at points of entry from truck routes to the village to give notice that this section is in effect. No person shall be charged with violating the provisions of this section by reason of operating a motor vehicle or motorized equipment contrary to the prohibition contained in subsection (a) of this section on a residential street unless appropriate signs are posted on such street or along the route traveled by the vehicle.
