

**PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE
JANUARY 24, 2011**

Chairman, Scott Kramer called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

Trustee members present: David Schroeder, Stephen Appell, Sally Hollebeak, James Coppernoll

Also present: President Jim Claeysen, Joe Caveny, Nancy Belt, Denny McMullen, Mark Painter, Rob Wilhelmi, Chris Cooper

Scott Kramer moved to adopt the agenda as presented. James Coppernoll seconded. Motion carried by voice vote.

Scott Kramer moved to approve the minutes of January 10, 2011. David Schroeder seconded. Motion carried by voice vote.

FEHR-GRAHAM – CCDD/SOIL LAWS

Scott Kramer asked Rob Wilhelmi from Fehr-Graham to address the committee. Mr. Wilhelmi presented a written summary on Public Act 96-1416 (CCDD) “Clean Construction or Demolition Debris”. He said since 2008, filling quarries, mines and other excavations” with CCDD has required a permit from the IEPA Bureau of Land. Mr. Wilhelmi continued to explain the requirements that licensed engineers rely on in making the uncontaminated soil certifications for placement of soil in a permitted CCDD fill operation. Scott Kramer thanked Mr. Wilhelmi and Mark Painter for attending and making the committee aware of Public Act 96 1416 CCDD.

SNOW ORDINANCE

President Jim Claeysen stated that our current ordinance Section 70-62 Winter Parking Regulations; snow removal; depositing snow on streets, **(a) Winter Parking Regulations are hereby declared to exist whenever a National Weather Service issues a Winter Storm Warning.**

President Claeysen said a winter storm warning was not issued last week when we received six inches of snow and made for some confusion with the village residents regarding **(b) it has be unlawful to park a motor vehicle on any residential village street from the time the Winter Storm Warning is issued.**

President Jim Claeysen and committee recommended reestablishing: **“ it shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle on any residential village street an emergency is herby declared to exist whenever two inches or more accumulates in any point within the village limits.**

Joe Caveny said that public works department has no problem with vehicles parking in the streets when plowing the issue is after the streets are plowed and the residents deposit snow upon the streets.

President Jim Claeysen suggested that the police department fax the media: **“ it shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle on any residential village street when an emergency is herby declared to exist whenever two inches or more accumulates in any point within the village limits.**

After much discussion it was the consensus to have Joe Caveny, Chief Todd Houde and Attorney Jim Stevens draft new language for Section 70-62 (a) & (b).

JURISDICTIONAL TRANSFER BELL SCHOOL ROAD

Joe Caveny informed the committee that the County of Winnebago has forwarded the paper work to Attorney Jim Stevens for the jurisdictional transfer of Bell School Road which will need village board approval.

WELL TESTING – LAYNE-WESTERN

Joe Caveny presented the committee with the amount of \$5,840.00 from Layne-Western to test the village's four wells. Joe Caveny noted that this project is not budgeted but the water account has line items that can pay for this project. Sally Hollembeak moved to send to the village board to hire Layne-Western to test the villages' four wells in the amount of \$5,840.00. James Coppernoll seconded. Motion carried by voice vote.

Scott Kramer moved to adjourn at 7:52 pm. James Coppernoll seconded. Motion carried by voice vote.
